DEFINITIONS:

- Courses:** A course is a series of sessions within a designated grouping. We offer sessions for Advisors, Master Teachers, and Deans. We offer numerous courses during the summer that are typically live events.
- Sessions:** Each session is equivalent to a certain number of credit hours. Completion of all sessions within a certain course can result in certification.
- Credit hours:** All core sessions are the equivalent of one credit hour. The credit hour value will vary for electives.
- Certification:** Receiving certification for Master Teacher training is not accredited by any outside agency. However, you will receive a certificate that, if need be, you can show others if they need assurance that you have received training from Tapestry University.

POLICIES:

1. TU faculty teaching in co-ops or Home Academies have two options:
 - Audit the Master Teacher series:
 - You pay as you go; there is a session fee. You can purchase core sessions (and some electives) as digital downloads or on discs through our Lampstand Press store.
 - Likewise, you may also take summer courses as electives; there are course fees you will incur.
 - You will not become a certified Master Teacher, but you can benefit from the presentation content, and choose to augment the sessions with homework if you wish.
 - You do not have the benefit (or work) of quizzes or extra, helpful resources that certification candidates enjoy, and homework is optional.
 - Become a certified Master Teacher:
 - To fully qualify, you also will have to become an Advisor as well.
 - Advisors must have used *Tapestry of Grace* for one year before they can become official.¹
 - Advisor training may be taken concurrently with Master Teacher training.
 - You must have finished both training courses with minimal passing grades before you can become a certified Master Teacher.
 - There is no time limit within which you must take both trainings; however, Advisors are required to renew their status yearly in January.
 - If you start as an auditor and wish to apply work from sessions you have purchased to a Master Teacher certification, you may. (You would need to call

and discuss this with Lampstand office staff.) You will need to take quizzes over all six core sessions and three elective credit hours.

- Master Teacher certification costs \$35 in addition to the class fee. This covers the additional work that Lampstand Staff must undertake in providing graded quizzes and other resources for your benefit.
2. Non-TU faculty are welcome to view MT classes.
- You may audit by paying a per-session fee, as do our faculty.
 - Because you do not use *Tapestry of Grace*, you will not qualify to become certified, since you cannot qualify to become an Advisor.
